### THE PLAN

To reach approximately 20,000 children in prison with food supplies, complete winter clothing, personal hygiene kits and educational support!

There are over 70 children's prison camps in Russia alone, to our knowledge. There may be more. These prison camps have little or no budget to keep the children healthy.

Approximately 4 million children living under bridges, abandoned houses and sometimes in the sewers of cities in Russia and Central Asia.

These children in the prison camps have been convicted of petty crimes they committed to feed themselves but the real crime is most have never known the love of Mom or Dad.



### COST OF PROJECT

Each prison averages 300 children. We are only able to reach a small portion of these prison camps holding forgotten children. A basic supply of clothing and food to supplement their diet will cost about \$30,000 per prison camp. When conditions are deemed completely intollerable and unlivable certain basic necessities are provided to immediately improve the situation that local governments have overlooked.

The costs per child is basically divided into three parts.

1. Food: \$35 per child will help provide a supply of nutritional supplemental food for a month to the kitchen. Food is bought locally and delivered to prison camps directly.
2. Clothing: For \$75 we can supply a complete set of warm winter clothing per child. Clothing packages are sewn up at women's prisons. They receive a small pay for their work and in turn are able to help the children in this way.
3. Education: Many institutions have no budget for supplies in order to give any meaningful education the children, which can help them to strive for a higher standard of life.
4. Other supplies: Prison camp kitchens often lack basic nessesities like freezers or refrigerators where fresh meat or vegetables can be kept safely without the danger of contanimation or spoiling.
