PTSD Book Completed Amid Bombings in Kyiv

Russia’s ongoing missile and drone attacks slowed the printing of a PTSD recovery book in Ukraine’s capital, Kyiv. Several strikes hit buildings next to the printing facility, and a nearby thermal power plant was destroyed. Yet despite these hardships, the work has continued. God’s protection has been clearly evident.

We have started dispersing the book through a distribution and pastoral care center serving the Kyiv region.

Written to support Ukrainians living under the weight of this war, the book is designed to provide both practical help and spiritual encouragement. The book is God’s response to the deep wounds that life’s darkest experiences—including this horrific war—can inflict on the soul. Psalm 23 speaks powerfully to trauma and the restoration of the soul. Its message brings comfort, peace, and hope to those who are hurting.

Our goal is to reach hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians, trusting God to provide the financial resources needed for this vital work. Every gift helps place the book into the hands of those who urgently need it.

In Israel, More Than Three Million People are Living With War-Related Trauma

We recently met with Messianic leaders in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem to discuss the escalating effects of PTSD. Since October 7, 2023, Israel has faced sustained terrorist attacks— Hamas from the west, Hezbollah from the north, and launches of rockets and drones from other directions as well. The result has been widespread trauma. More than three million Jewish people are now living with the emotional and psychological effects of missiles and rockets.

In response, we are beginning preparations for Hebrew and Russian editions of our 180-page trauma book. Please pray that God will enable us to serve His chosen people in this time of deep tragedy, and that many will find comfort, hope, and healing through the power of God's Word.



A Faith-Filled Vision for Ethiopia—Four Million by 2029

We traveled to Addis Ababa for three days to meet with Ethiopian church leaders. Together, we are planning a Mega City Media Campaign which has the potential to become the largest evangelistic outreach on the African continent.

If everything proceeds as expected, the campaign will launch on October 1 of this year. Ethiopian leaders have set a bold, faith-filled goal: that by 2029, four million new believers will be added to the Church. The scope of this work is enormous—and only God can accomplish it.

As we've learned through years of ministry in

major cities, we are completely dependent on God's guidance, wisdom, and protection. That dependence feels even greater as 2026 opens into a new season of missions in a politically turbulent and challenging world. That is exactly why the light of the Gospel is more urgent than ever.

We can do only what God sends us to do—and only as supporters and intercessors stand with us. Your prayers and partnership help make it possible for thousands upon thousands to hear about Jesus—people who might otherwise never have the opportunity.



GCMM Presence at a Key Event in Saudi Arabia

GCMM helped fund a remarkable event in Saudi Arabia. In Riyadh, an orchestra was able—for the first time—to share music with children and youth through two school concerts: one attended by about 800 boys and another by about 800 girls. The orchestra also performed an evening concert for royalty and invited guests.

One organizer said what they witnessed was “deeply moving.” Afterward, attendees approached

with tears in their eyes, describing how the music brought them peace, comfort, and hope—moments that felt like a clear touch of the Holy Spirit.

Music can speak when words fall short. It reminds us that God opens doors we would never dare to imagine. God said, “Let there be light,” and it happened—His light shines even in dark places. If the Lord allows, this is only the beginning.



Mongolia Christmas Concert Launches “Power to Change 2026” Campaign

In Ulaanbaatar, churches from 7 districts joined forces for the 2025 Christmas concert, focusing on inviting new attendees to the concert. Tickets sold out quickly. People called from Ulaanbaatar, from the outlying provinces, and even from abroad, asking for complimentary tickets for their family and friends. Before the Christmas concert, an evangelism event was held near the Central Cultural Palace.

The concert launched the *Power to Change 2026* campaign. Local churches want to give the *Power to Change* book to everyone who responds to the gospel invitation. They will also offer child-focused gospel materials and New Testaments for children as gifts. For this campaign, New Testaments and brochures do need replenishing, and our desire is to provide at least **3,000** more copies of the *Power to Change* books so they can be distributed to new believers.



Campaign Invitation to Nigeria—Another Opportunity to Reach Millions

At the Global Leaders Congress in Nigeria, more than 25,000 pastors and ministry leaders from 100 countries gathered and were challenged to reach the lost—whatever the cost. In the wake of that call, a new door has opened for us to bring the “Power to Change” campaign to Nigeria, a nation where there is the opportunity to reach millions for Christ.
